## **1. Initial orientations**

This edict is about selective process for:

- A) Working Groups (WGs);
- B) Special Working Groups (AWGs);
- C) Round Tables (MR);
- D) Panels (Ps); and
- E) Communication (Com).

### ***1.1 Working Groups (WGs)***

The Working Groups (WGs) are composed of strategic themes previously presented by the Scientific Committee and contributions of colleagues from CIRIEC International.

The themes of the GTs of the event are listed in Annex 1 of this Notice. Up to 10 papers will be selected by WG for oral presentation and publication.

The Working Groups operate in three stages:

- A) Submission of Summary - Deadline 06/31/2017
- B) Submission of Full Work - 10/31/2017
- C) Dissemination of the works designated for oral presentation - 08/30/17

Note: The works that are not approved for the oral modality, will be assigned automatically to the mode poster or communication.

Abstracts and full papers will only be sent through an online electronic system, available at [www.even3.com.br/CIRIEC](http://www.even3.com.br/CIRIEC). Proposals sent by e-mail, conventional mail, directly to the coordination of the activity or to the secretariat of CIRIEC BRASIL will not be accepted. Exceptionally summaries sent to other emails will be redirected to the above address.

The dates and places of the presentations of the selective works will be announced together with the final programming of the event in a specific announcement.



In order to send the abstract, the researcher must complete the general registration form and then submit his / her scientific collaboration, with a title of the paper, to the simple abstract (up to 1200 characters with space) for the coordination to have a more in-depth understanding of the proposal at the time of its evaluation. Deadline 06/30/2017 - for composition of support material. From the beginning of the registrations up to 60 days (maximum) after the deadline the evaluators (Scientific Committee) will be expressing their opinions on the respective summaries.

The Complete Work must contain: a) title of the research; B) data from other authors, if any; C) research promotion agency (if any); D) object and objectives: an overview of research with a clear definition of the object and objectives; E) Methodology: synthesis of the methodology or approach of the research and its sources; F) results and conclusions: indicate the main results and conclusions obtained, in accordance with the proposed objectives; G) Synthetic Bibliographic References; As well as any other information that may be considered pertinent, and may not exceed 35 pages. Deadline 10/31/2017 - for the composition of the proceedings of the conference.

Up to 4 co-authors per article will be admitted.

You can only submit the abstract and submit the complete paper for publication to the researcher who will pay for the registration to the event.

For the publication of the article it is necessary the presentation by at least one author.

The approved abstracts may be re-assigned to Working Groups (or Working Sessions) by decision of the Scientific Committee for the best development of the work.

The author (s) should indicate, in the submission of the abstract, if the modality will be Oral Presentation, Poster or Communication. It is also necessary to which GT the work is intended.

It is understood by Poster the works directed to only the exhibition where the norms are exposed soon to follow. By communication abstracts and final papers where the author (s) will not be present at the event. But all will receive the respective certificates.

### **1.2 - Special Working Groups (AWGs)**

Those interested in proposing, coordinating and organizing a Special Working Group (GTE's) may submit a proposal by the date of 03/20/17 by the event's website.

The proposer of themes for the GTEs must have a minimum degree of DOCTOR. The proposals will be evaluated and selected by the CIRIEC Scientific Committee, taking into account the criteria of regional and institutional diversity and the thematic relevance of the proposal. The proposal of an EWG should not be in line with any of the WGs already proposed in Annex 1, and it is necessary that this theme surrounds



one of the balancing areas of the conference (Solidarity and Social Economy, Sustainability and Innovation).

At this stage, the coordinators-proponents should register through the website and indicate data such as academic degree, activity title, menu, justification, relevance of the proposal, as well as any other information they deem relevant. It is forbidden to submit more than one thematic proposal by the same coordinator (s).

The result of the approval of the GTEs will be announced on 03/31/2017.

Once accepted, the GTE proposer will be responsible for the selection of the abstracts sent to the approved AWG and coordinate the activities of the AWG at the day and place to be designated by the Scientific Committee and the organization of the event.

The submission, formatting, and submission rules will be the same as those applied to Workgroups.

You can only submit the paper and send the complete paper for publication to the researcher who will pay for the registration of the event.

### **1.3 The Round Tables**

The process for sending proposals for round tables should also be done via the Internet, through the Conference website. Each proposal should indicate a coordinator and up to three exhibitors, who will present different points of view on the proposed theme. It should be noted that due to its different format, criteria such as seniority, academic qualification and notorious specialization of the participants in the proposed theme will have a greater weight in the selection by the Scientific Committee. Important: every round table participant, be it coordinator, exhibitor and debater (if any), must register in the administrative system of the event with access by the address

Each proposal must indicate, in specific fields of the online form: - Title of the roundtable; - Registration of Participants, therefore, as mentioned above, all participants of the table must register at the address of the site that the system recognizes responsible at the time the coordinator-proponent is to enter their names.

NOTE: If the proposing coordinator invites a foreign researcher to participate in the roundtable, he / she should notify him / her that the accreditation and payment of the registration fee is obligatory for all the guests.

The deadline for submission of the Round Table proposals is 05/31/17 and the communication of the "accepted" will be on 06/30/17.

### **1.4 – Panels**



The subscribers will be able to opt for the presentation of Panels content the synthesis of their searches.

As already mentioned, it is mandatory to register at the event and the panel's presentation to make the publication effective.

It is the responsibility of the Scientific Committee to organize the activities in order to allow a brief oral presentation of each of the scheduled panels - in addition to possible additional dialogues with the public at times when the group session is not taking place.

Selected panels will be exposed in a single place / space for all days of the event.

The researcher will only have published his work in full if the panel is exposed at the VI Conference and its registration has been carried out.

The Scientific Committee will indicate the three best panels for the award / certification of the best panel of the event

Each panelist exhibitor is responsible for the fixation (on a hook at the place already prepared for it) of his panel in the space destined from the first day of the event

It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to prepare their panel.

Panel size: 0.90m wide by 1.20m high.

The panel text must be legible at least two meters apart.

Use a simple, easy-to-read font with visible size at the distance indicated in the previous item.

Color combinations that allow good contrast (eg, black on white, dark green on white, dark blue on white, dark red on white, white on black, white on dark blue) should be used in the composition of the panel. Never use: red with green or red with blue.

Do not use heavy paper or cardboard, which makes fixing difficult, since it will be prohibited to use nails or tacks on the panels.

Organize the information so that the core ideas of the work are easily grasped and / or captured.

It is allowed to use pictures, photos, tables, charts and possible diagrams, besides the text of communication. Use all available resources to make the panel interest the public.

Content of the panel: • TITLE OF WORK (written in capital letters); • AUTHOR; • INSTITUTION OF THE AUTHOR; • RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (if any); • OBJECTIVE AND OBJECTIVES: Overview of the research with a clear definition of the



object and objectives; • **METHODOLOGY**: give a compact idea of the methodology or approach of the research and its sources; • **RESULTS AND CONCLUSIONS**: Indicate the main results and conclusions obtained, in accordance with the proposed objectives; • **SYNTHETIC BIBLIOGRAPHICAL REFERENCES**.

A ppt template will be made available on the event website.

Papers that are submitted as an oral presentation and are not selected will automatically be assigned to the poster presentation.

The deadline for submitting proposals for Panels is 08/31/17 and the acceptance will be announced on 09/30/17.

### **1.5 General Considerations**

- Certificates and publication: a) Both the first author and the co-authors, provided that they are duly registered and present at the event, with the consequent presentation of the programmed works, will receive certificates of participation; B) Only the selected papers will be published in electronic format and will be presented by the author (s) in the event, with the proper discharge of the registration fees.
- Collaborations of graduate or undergraduate researchers (FOR THE YOUNG RESEARCHERS CATEGORY) will be accepted as long as the papers are written as coauthor and the author-supervisor has a minimum academic status as a master. Works derived from dissertations and course completion work will be accepted.
- The use of works and research that belong to third parties, partially or in full, without the proper credit and pre-authorization of the involved (s), constitutes a serious fault and may imply the exclusion of those involved from all promoted academic activities By CIRIEC.
- The **FIRST AUTHOR** will be formally considered the **RESPONSIBLE** for the presentation of the work in the event;
- Up to 4 authors (1 **AUTHOR** AND 3 **CO-AUTHORS**) can be nominated for each work enrolled.
- The proper and correct identification of the authors of each paper composes one of the ethical pillars of the academic-scientific activity. In this sense, attention must be paid to the indication of the authors really involved in the production of the researches to be presented. At the time of submission, some co-authors will be requested (full name, e-mail, home address).

### **10) Work at Ecosol**

Ementa: Decent work, social and productive inclusion, precariousness, eradication of child labor, degrading work, cooperative work, EES work relations, informal work, labor protection, autonomy, worker and worker health, income generation, social rights , Labor cooperatives, trade unionism

### **11) Entrepreneurship and Essol**

Menu: social entrepreneurship, youth companies, social startups, creative economy, crowdfunding, 3rd sector, public and private EES incubators

### **12) Young researchers**

Ementa: Research and academic work of young researchers at undergraduate level. Work completed and in development.

### **13) Various panels on Essol**

Ementa: Themes that do not fall into previous groups, but which concern the social and solidarity Economy.

### **14) Non-formal spaces and education**

Ementa: Actions of education, entrepreneurship and activities of any other nature planned and / or developed in non-formal spaces

### **15) Food Security and Nutrition**

Ementa: Related issues to food security, nutrition, family farming and related research.

### **16) Traditional Peoples and Sustainability**

Ementa: Themes that involve sustainability in research, studies and practices developed with traditional peoples.
